About the Maternal, Infant, and Early Childhood Home Visiting (MIECHV) Program Outcomes Dashboard

The Maternal, Infant, and Early Childhood Home Visiting (MIECHV) Program Outcomes Dashboard was developed as a requirement by the Jackie Walorski Maternal and Child Home Visiting Reauthorization Act of 2022 within the Consolidated Appropriations Act, 2023. The MIECHV Program provides federal funding for home visiting programs in all 50 states, the District of Columbia, and five U.S. territories. There are 24 home visiting models that can be funded by MIECHV, and each model has slightly different goals. The Health Resources and Services Administration (HRSA) requires programs that receive MIECHV funding (awardees) to collect and report data on who enrolls in their programs, which services they use, and performance measures for six benchmark areas.

The MIECHV Program Outcomes Dashboard displays program reach, participant characteristics, and benchmark data at national and awardee levels as well as data on home visiting models that are currently implemented with MIECHV funding.

On this dashboard, you can:

- View a national overview of the MIECHV Program
- View a profile of each awardee, including:
 - Key data on program size and reach
 - o Information on the characteristics of the participants served
 - o Information on each home visiting model used
 - o Information on the awardee needs assessment
- View national or awardee level benchmark performance data, including:
 - Most recent annual outcomes achieved on performance measures organized by benchmark area
 - o Details on each benchmark measure and historical data, with filters
 - o Information on demonstration of improvement assessment results
- View a profile of each evidence-based home visiting model implemented with MIECHV funds and how each model is expected to affect participant outcomes
